3.1 MAIN ASPECTS

- Form of study full-time/combined
- Standard period of study 4 years
- Maximal period of study 8 years
- Individual study plan (ISP) should be created within two months after the enrolment to study. It determines the course of the study for each of the students. It consists of:
 - Obligatory courses http://lfp.cuni.cz/clanek/337o-povinne-kurzy-pro-doktorandy-compulsory-courses-for-phd-students.html
 - Publications: 3-4 publications during the studies are required (each study programme has specific requirements);
 - Plan of foreign stays and research internships (compulsory for students in the full-time form of study);
 - Participation in the Students' Scientific Conference organized once a year; compulsory for PhD students in 2nd, 3rd and 4th years of studies
 - 2 exams related to the topic of the dissertation thesis and the state exam
 - Name of the dissertation thesis
- The fulfillment of the obligations stated in ISP is controlled annually. The student submits short report about his or her study, which is then approved by the Supervisor and the Subject Area Board
- The role of the Supervisor is essential for the doctoral study. The Supervisor continuously monitors the fulfillment of the student's study obligations and consults the results of the study with the student on a regular basis. The Supervisor also approves the proposed dissertation and helps the student formulate it.
- The study in the doctoral study programme is monitored and evaluated by the Subject Area Board.
- Mobility of researchers forms an integral part of the PhD studies. Among others, internships abroad are supported by ERASMUS+, the mobility fund, inter-university agreements or faculty agreements.
- Students participate in science support programs. The University offers a variety of projects. The backbone of the system consists of PROGRES programs which provide basic institutional support for scientific activities in the University. Other projects are for example GA UK project (https://cuni.cz/UKEN-753.html), UNCE program or PRIMUS program. 3.3 COMPLETION OF PHD STUDIES

The study is properly completed by the **State Doctoral Examination** and **defence of the dissertation** after which the title Ph.D. is awarded.

Final dissertation theses proves the ability and readiness for independent activity in the area of research or development or an independent theoretical and creative activity.

The defence of the Dissertation can be done after the fulfillment of all study requirements, i.e. requirements stated in the individual study plan.

Special attention must be paid to the originality of the work and personal data protection. The **Turnitin system**, in particular, is used at Charles University for checking the originality of theses and online support of academic writing.

3.4 SCHOLARSHIPS AND BURSARIES

PhD students may be awarded the following scholarships and bursaries according to the Scholarship and Bursary Rules of Charles University:

- Doctoral bursary if studying in full-time studies for a standard period of study 4 years. The bursary is paid as a regular monthly amount and ranges from 11,250 CZK to 18,500 CZK. It is increased after fulfilment of a student's study requirements (publications and state exam)
- Bursary for outstanding achievement in research, development and innovation, for artistic or other creative contributing to greater knowledge
- Bursary granted in cases worthy of special consideration (participation in teaching and research activities, work in laboratories, contributions to the development of information technologies, international cooperation, excellent sports achievements, representation of the University, or laudable citizen acts, etc.)

4.1 VISA AND RESIDENCE PERMIT

• If you are a citizen of EU/EEA countries or Switzerland you don't need any permit for living and working in the Czech Republic. If your stay exceeds 3 months you must register with the Immigration Police and may ask for temporary residence permit (necessary for obtaining "rodné číslo" used for various administrative procedures).

• In case of **researchers from the third countries** staying in the Czech Republic for longer than 3 months, it is recommended to apply for a long-term residence permit for the purpose of scientific research – "**scientific permit**". The Faculty of Medicine in Pilsen signs with the researcher a **Hosting agreement** which facilitates the legal procedure.

4.2 WORKING IN THE CZECH REPUBLIC

Citizens of EU/EEA member states, as well as third country nationals who have long term residence permits for the purpose of research have the **right to work in the Czech Republic without a work permit**.

Standard working week in the Czech Republic according to the Labour Code is **40 hours** a week, usually divided into five working days.

Some employers offer contracts with **flexible working time**, when the employee may choose to work during a part of the working hours according to his or her needs, or **part-time work** with shorter working hours.

The three basic forms of work contract are:

- Pracovní poměr (HPP) standard full-time or part-time employment;
- Dohoda o provedení činnosti (DPČ) work not exceeding 20 hours a week;
- Dohoda o provederní práce (DPP) temporary work not exceeding 300 hours per calendar year;
- A self-employed person who has trade licence (živnostenský list) works independently without work contract.



5.1 GETTING TO PILSEN

Bus and train connections between Prague and Pilsen are frequent with the journey lasting approximately 1.5 hours. The journey by car takes approximately 1 hour.

- Arriving by train international trains (EC, IC) arrive at two railway stations in Prague: Main Train Station (Hlavní nádraží) in the center of Prague and Holešovice Railway Station (Nádraží Holešovice). Direct trains to Pilsen depart daily from the railway stations Smíchov.
- Arriving by bus most buses linking Pilsen and Prague depart from Zličín Bus Terminal almost every hour.

5.2 ENROLMENT

The enrolment to study takes place at the **end of September or beginning of October**; the exact date is determined by the Dean and posted at the Faculty web page.

Students receive the **Student's card** and may choose one of two types of cards:

- CU student card combined with international ISIC card (annual fee approximately 320 CZK)
- Standard CU student card

Students take a matriculation oath.

5.3 INSURANCE

The Czech public health insurance system is based on obligatory participation of insured persons. Health insurance is required in case of foreign nationals in the Czech Republic and it is ensured by **participation in public health insurance program**. Registration in one of the health insurance companies is required; the largest one is VZP:

After your arrival to the Czech Republic when you are not yet registered for public health insurance, you must have **alternative** (**travel**) **health insurance**, either from a commercial insurance company or the European Health Insurance Card EHIC.

In case of employment, the employer is obliged to pay regular insurance premiums which are deducted from the employee's salary.

5.5.2 Student Residence Halls

- Dormitory Bolevecká located in walking distance from the city center and from the Faculty campus:
 - The largest of Pilsen halls of residence.
 - 344 places is (20 single rooms, 144 double rooms, two single rooms and double rooms always share one bathroom; 9 rooms for four, with their own bathrooms).
 - All rooms are equipped with a fridge and little kitchenette.
 - 11 places for tourists.
 - Free Wi-fi connection, study rooms, TV rooms, laundry room, drying rooms, table tennis room, bike storage and vending machines with hot drinks and soft drinks and sale of sandwiches at the reception of the building, parking place in front of the building.
 - Public transport: tram lines No 1 and 4 and bus lines No 25, 33, 34, 40.
- Dormitory Heyrovského located in the Bory suburb, close to the University Hospital.
 - 180 places with accommodation in 60 double and 20 triple rooms.
 - Rooms equipped with a fridge and shared kitchenettes on each floor. Two rooms always share one bathroom and toilet.
 - Free Wi-fi connection, study rooms, laundry, fitness and common room.
 - No 16 trolley bus, ride to the city center takes 15 minutes.
 - Public transport: No 16, 14 trolley bus lines, No 23, 32, N1 and N4 bus lines.
- Dormitory Šafránkův pavilion located in walking distance from the University Hospital and the Faculty campus:

- The smallest of Pilsen halls of residence.
- 128 students can be accommodated in double rooms.
- Shared bathrooms and kitchenette are on each of the four floors, also 6 double rooms with their own bathroom and kitchenette.
- Each room equipped with a fridge.
- Free Wi-fi connection, study room, fitness, laundry, bike storage, student refectory and vending machines with hot drinks and soft drinks.
- The city center is 2 stops (No 4 tram line) from the building.
- Public transport: tram lines No 4 and No 1, and bus lines No 25, 33, 40, N1 and N4.

The reservations of accommodation are accepted **from May**. A student applies for accommodation at the Faculty. The confirmation of the reservation is subject to the payment of deposit and the first month rent. The deadline for payment is till **31**st **August**.

6.4 DINING FACILITIES

The Canteen and the Café are located in the faculty premises (alej Svobody 76, Pilsen 323 00). Student card is needed for payment in the dining facilities.

6.5 STUDY INFORMATION SYSTEM (SIS)

The SIS is an administrative support of the study agenda.

It is used for submitting the **individual study plan**, for registration of the **fulfilment of study obligations** and of the **annual assessment of studies** and for uploading the **dissertation thesis**.

The SIS uses the common login and the password to CAS (Central Authentication Service) received after the enrolment.

6.6 VACCINATION

Vaccination of medical students is obligatory according to the Czech legislation. Doctoral students should acquire the vaccination against **hepatitis B** until 31 **March of the first year of studies**. A certificate of the vaccination should be submitted to the Department of Science and Research.

6.7 STUDENTS WITH SPECIAL NEEDS

The Faculty of Medicine in Pilsen supports students with disabilities who require modification of entrance examination, study conditions or removing physical barriers either for a certain period of time or for the whole period of studies.

6.11 LIVING IN PILSEN

The city of Pilsen is an industrial and cultural center of West Bohemia. It has over 170,000 inhabitants and is situated about 90 km southwest of Prague and 70 km east of the German border. It is surrounded by beautiful countryside and is famous for its Pilsner Urquell brewery, the Skoda factory and the University of West Bohemia. The historic center of the city offers many places of cultural interest (theatres, concert halls, a modern State Scientific Library, museum, historical underground, and cinemas) as well as numerous sport facilities (swimming pools, gyms, and bowling clubs). Pilsen also frequently hosts scientific congresses and gatherings.

6.11.1 Getting Around

Pilsen City Transport Company (PMDP) ensures the majority of public transport in Pilsen. The main means of transport in the city are trams, trolleybuses and buses.

6.11.4 A few tips for easy travel by Public Transport of Pilsen

- It is advisable to purchase a ticket before entering the carriage. A ticket sold by a
 driver is more expensive and its purchase prolongs the time spent at the stop.
- When entering the carriage with a wheelchair, a pram or a dog, use the doors that are designated for this only – they are marked by a symbol of wheelchair, pram or dog.
- It is necessary to inform the driver by a hand wave before entering the carriage with a pram, a wheelchair, a bicycle, a large piece of luggage or dog and wait for his/her consent or refusal.
- Transporting bicycles is permitted during weekends and on public holidays only.

- Front doors in buses and trolleybuses are designated for physically disabled passengers only or can be used in case the passenger wants to purchase a ticket from the driver.
- To get off, it is necessary to press a self-service button to open the door (it is green in most carriages)
- For boarding at a request stop, it is necessary to visibly signal with your arm to the driver in advance. Press the "STOP" button when getting off.

6.11.5 Driving

You may drive a car in the Czech Republic if you are a holder of a Czech driver's license or a driver's license of EU member state or Norway, Iceland, Switzerland, Liechtenstein or a driver's license of non-EU country that complies with the conditions specified in the Convention on Road Traffic (Vienna 1968).

6.11.7 The Best Places to Visit

Pilsen offers a variety of places and monuments which you shouldn't miss. Among them:

- The central Republic square with its St. Bartholomew's Cathedral. This Gothic church famous for the argillite statue of Pilsen Madonna offers also great sights from its spire, the tallest one in the Czech Republic.
- When visiting the Historical Underground located in the original brewing house and built under the city center in the 14th century you can learn about the history of the city and the brewing industry.
- The **Great Synagogue**, the third largest synagogue in Europe, reminds the Jewish community living in Pilsen before the Nazzi occupation in 1939 1945. It now serves as a concert and exhibition hall.
- The Interiors created by Adolf Loos in the 1930's have exceptional architectonic value and can be seen in several apartments in Pilsen.
- The brewery tradition has been connected with Pilsen nearly since its foundation and the world renowned lager Pilsner Urquell is exported to more than 50 countries. Guided tours in the brewery offer an insight into history and current operation of the beer production.

The surroundings of Pilsen is formed by a beautiful countryside suitable for cycling or one-day trips. You can visit historical and religious monuments, a few of them are listed below:

- Castles and chateaux:
 - Švihov castle is a well-protected medieval fortress; it can be reached from Pilsen within 30 minutes.
 - Castle of Horšovský Týn is one of the most opened castles to the public in the Czech Republic with several guided tours showing Gothic castle, Renaissance chateau, chateau library and others.
 - Castle and chateau Bečov nad Teplou a Gothic castle located upon the river Teplá
 preserving the second most valuable relic in the Czech Republic after the crown
 jewels reliquary of St Maurus.
 - Kozel Chateau, a Classicist hunting chateau located in charming surroundings offering tours in historical interiors is within a reach from Pilsen.
 - Radyně Castle is a medieval fortress only several kilometers south of Pilsen. It is situated on a hill of the same name.
- Monasteries:
 - In the town of Plasy it is possible to visit the former Cistercian Abbey of the Assumption of the Virgin Mary; buildings and premises of the convent are the work of the architect Jan Blažej Santini-Aichel.
 - In the Benedictine monastery in Kladruby, at its time one of the largest and richest in the Czech lands, you will discover the unique architectural style known as Gothic Baroque.
